Originally inspired by the Tsunamika, 3D toys from AgniJata offer a fun and interactive way to educate children and adults

OMBINING fun with creativity, Ekaterina Vygodskaya from Russia makes toys with a purpose. Her yearold brand, named after her Indian name AgniJata, is aimed at adding a generous portion of fun to the process of education. The toys that are 3D cut-outs can trigger your tots' imagination, says AgniJata. "While cutting out and folding a funny toy, a child's mind goes deep into the 3D world, understands shape and volume and begins understanding crafts, "she explains.



Originally from St Petersburg, Vygodskaya played with paper —cutting, folding and gluing— as a child, and says she owes her creativity to her father, who spent his last years designing educational toys for blindchildren. Speaking about what drew her to Auroville, she says, "I first heard about it in 2002 and there was no doubt that I wanted to live

here and participate in the experience of conscious evolution of mankindthat was initiated by the Mother and Sri Aurobindo. I also love India for its beauty, sincerity and depth in everything - people, smiles, gods, nature," she offers

After the Tsunamika

The idea for AgniJata came to her in 2005 when she was working on



the Tsunamika Project at the Pondicherry-based Upasana Design Studio. "Tsunamika is a small doll that helped hundreds of women living on the sea shore survive after the tsunami. The idea of Upasana was fantastic - that women were producing these funny dolls which were never sold! I had to design paper products with the

Tsunamika doll. First there were postcards, fridge stickers and small notepads. Later, I started creating educational toys with Tsunamika checkers and craft sets and later, Tsunamika's friends —lion, ele-phant, cow and donkey!'' she explains. She decided to start her own unit to include other animals like the whale, tiger, kangaroo, monkey, turtle and zebra



What you get Available as 'craft sets' (at ₹140 onwards) like Safari, Funny Farm, India, Australia and Cats and Dogs, each toy has region-specific animals introducing tots to geography. "For instance, in Australia you can play with the kangaroo - you see, it is carrying its baby in the pouch on the belly!— and koala, penguin and frilled-

necked lizard-hemakes his necklace bright and big, when he is fright-ened—"explains Vygodskaya, adding that the toys help develop motor skills and the tactile sense and prepares tots for further studies in subjects like geometry and design. "The toy sappeal to those aged from 6 to 99, as there is no age limit for fun and happiness! If parents join the game, a simple family evening can transform into a fantastic adventure," she says.

Up next

"I would like to introduce 'Agnijata -Educational toys' to schools, as the more interesting the process of education, the better results kids will achieve," offers Vygodskaya. She has recently collaborated with Laila Games, Auroville to produce 'Coconaka' for older kids, 'Evolution,' created by a Russian biologist is also ready to be launched. The sets are available at stores like Casablanca, Nilgiris and Aurobo-utique in Pondicherry and Landma-rk, Naturally Auroville and Higgin-bothams in Chennai. "We soon plan to include distributors in Mumbai, Bangalore and the rest of the country," she says. Details: www.agnijata.com
